TYRRELL SHED

Back in the late 1970s and early 1980s I was working as a junior reporter for a local newspaper in Surrey and living with my parents in a village called East Horsley where fellow residents included Bill Pertwee (ARP warden Hodges in Dad's Army) and Mollie Sugden (Mrs Slocombe in Are you Being Served?).

In my spare time I helped out on local hospital radio where one of our other volunteers worked in the neighbouring village of Ockham where she was secretary to Ken Tyrrell, founder of the famous Grand Prix team which won three F1 drivers' championships.



On a number of occasions, I collected her from her office to go onto our hospital radio shift - this involved driving up to the main Tyrrell base, which was just a shed in the Tyrrell family timber yard in the middle of the Surrey countryside, (see above) nothing like the high-tech modern Formula One team headquarters of today.

I had imagined that the shed had long ago either fallen or been demolished until I read that it was still standing but under threat from development on the industrial estate which had grown up on the site of the timber yard.

Good news is that thanks to a deal between the shed's present owner, a partyware company called Club Green (who had bought the shed from the Tyrrell family in 2001 on the understanding that it would be preserved) and the Goodwood Estate, the structure is being disassembled before being transported to the Goodwood Circuit. A previous plan had been to re-locate it not far away to the Brooklands Museum.

After arriving at Goodwood, the shed will be reconstructed on the Hurricane Lawn, behind the Woodcote Grandstand before the chicane in time for the Members' Meeting in April - so I will be able to see it again when I next visit the circuit.

RAIN STOPS PLAY

Bad news for those of us who had planned to visit Christchurch Quay on Bank Holiday Monday 01 April for the hugely popular classic car gathering.

The prolonged period of rain in recent months and the forecast for more this week has already forced the organisers to cancel their first meeting of the year due to the waterlogged state of the Quomps.

Sign-up for the 1020 Spring Road Run

The April club night is the final opportunity to book in for the 1020 Spring Road Run and Pub Lunch on Drive It Day, Sunday 21 April - the run will venture east into the picturesque New Forest with the promise of glimpses of the Isle of Wight.

Chris Adamson and Pat Lodge have planned what they hope will be an interesting and scenic 46-mile road route starting from the Sammy Miller Motorcycle Museum at New Milton.

Participants can arrive from 10am (when the Bashley Tea Rooms open) for a tea or a coffee or something more substantial (they do an excellent cooked breakfast) before setting out - cars are asked to be away by 10.30am.

The route heads into the forest through Beaulieu (it is Simply Italian day at Beaulieu so expect to see lots of Ferraris and Maseratis on your way) and Exbury to Lepe (with views across to the Isle of Wight) and then back via Lymington and Milford-on-Sea before lunch at The Amberwood pub at Walkford, where we will have reserved tables in the main restaurant - cars should arrive between 12noon and 12.30pm.

The set-lunch selection (varying prices depend on meal chosen) features roast beef, roast turkey or roast lamb with a nut roast vegetarian option, plus a choice of desserts: fruit crumble, bread and butter pudding, ice cream and a cheese board. Drinks should be ordered and paid for at the bar.

Menu choices must be made at the time of booking (full details of prices on the entry form) but payment is only required on the day.



However, there is a £10 per person deposit requirement (cash preferred) - this will be refunded as cash on the day.

The food deposit is in addition to the usual £5 per car entry fee which includes a road route book and rally plaque.

After lunch there is the opportunity to return to the Sammy Miller Museum (which is just a few miles up the road - directions will be provided). The museum is offering discounted entry of £9 per person on production of your 1020 membership card (normally £13 for adults and £11 for seniors).

Entry forms are available from Chris Adamson at club night (or via email: chris@1020mg.org.uk) - reminder entries close on Monday 01 April.

Club display at Verwood Rustic Fayre?

Interest has been expressed in the club taking part in the Verwood Rustic Fayre on the August Bank Holiday Monday - we are now seeking a show of hands for those keen to take part in this popular local event.

The organisers have changed the arrangements for vehicle displays at Potterne Park this year and are now no longer offering individual club display spaces at a set fee. Instead, they will be charging individual owners £7.50 per car booked in advance.

The only way that clubs can be parked together will be if all the cars arrive together so this would involve assembling locally beforehand at a set time (likely to be around 11am). Then club cars will need to drive in convoy and arrive and be parked together before the 11.30am closing time prior to the show opening to the public at 11.45am. Cars would then be required to stay on site until 4.30pm.

Although the event is several months ahead, Pip and Ursula Bonner have volunteered to organise the club cars if there is sufficient interest - they will be looking for a show of interest at the April club night.

Classic cars will be invited to Christchurch Quay on no less than eight occasions in 2024 - that is weather (ie rain and water level) permitting.

Organiser Ashley Miller (who says he will be involved in the Christchurch events only this year) has announced the schedule which, this year, as well as Sundays also includes several Bank Holiday Mondays.

The first of a Bank Holiday trio was due to be on Monday 01 April but, due to the waterlogged nature of the Quomps and the forecast for further rain, this has now been cancelled.

Hopefully things will have dried out for the next scheduled meeting which is Sunday 21 April - unfortunately for club members this clashes with the 1020 Spring Road Run.

All the dates and times are subject to change, variation or cancellation due to the weather and ground conditions.

Lulworth Classic Car Show

Dorset Blind Association's Motor Show, for all ages of car, returns to Lulworth Castle for its eighth year on Sunday 12 May and 1020 hopes to have enough club cars to have a presence.

Last year over 5,000 visitors attended, there were 230 cars (ranging from classics and hot rods to sportscars and supercars) on display and it raised £22,000 for the charity - as the event is always popular an early booking is advised. This year it will be an entirely static event - the morning road run of previous years having been dropped for 2024.



Entry fee for those exhibiting their car is £12 per person (plus a £1.70p booking fee) which includes a breakfast bap, hot drink, admission to the showground and entry to Lulworth Castle.

The showground will be open to the public from 11am until 4pm (display cars can arrive earlier) and the event also features live entertainment, a kids' fun area, street food, and stalls selling local artisan craft and produce.

Our big day out at Athelhampton House

Put the date in your diary now . . Sunday 18 August 2024.

This will be our annual 1020 Garden Party and Picnic at Athelhampton House near Dorchester when we invite MG owners from across the region to join us. It is also our major fund-raising activity of the year for our charities Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance and Macmillan Caring Locally.

The entry fees have been held at the 2023 prices - this means it will be £10 per person if booked in advance or £12 per person on the day. This gives admission to the event and the Athelhampton gardens.

Athelhampton House recently became Britain's first carbon neutral manor house following the installation of an array of solar panels and ground heat source pumps which has significantly reduced their energy consumption.



Those who are interested in the technology can join an Eco Tour on the day given by general manager Owen Davies - this needs to be booked in advance via the Athelhampton website.

On the rear lawns we will have our usual selection of stands including the tombola, wine draw, jigsaws and name the dog.

Volunteers will be needed to staff the welcome gate, organise the parking and supervise the stalls. Full details and entry forms will be available in the coming months.

Brooklands hosts final MG100

The final national event to mark 100 years of the MG brand takes place over the weekend of 18-19 May and includes road runs and a visit to Brooklands Museum.

Organised by the South East MG Car Club and MG Owners Club the event is planned as a celebration of all things MG.

Over the weekend participants can join one of several road runs on the Saturday - the closest for local MG owners is from the Bush Inn at Ovington, New Alresford in Hampshire departing between 10.30am and 11am. Entry fee is £15 per car and includes rally plate, email route plan and tea/coffee at the start.



Routes will lead to The Fairmile in Cobham, Surrey where there will be a display of cars, live music and a buffet (£18).

The event will also be hosting a leg of the Round Britain MG cavalcade relay with a special guest over both days as it comes down from Essex and before it heads off to Hampshire.

Coach trip visits new motor museum

Everyone on the full coach enjoyed a fascinating club day out to Taunton to visit the new County Classics Motor Museum and Perry's Cider Farm at Dowlish Wake.

After the relatively congestion-free journey to Taunton, the majority of members headed straight for the motor museum which sits on the main shopping street in the Somerset town located in the former County Stores building. Others chose to go for coffee and some stepped across the road to visit the Somerset County Museum which charts the history of the county.

At the museum we were joined by three members of the Taunton MGOC including their Area Secretary Bob England.

There was unanimous agreement that museum founder Patrick Hawkins and his team of volunteers have done a fantastic job in creating a fascinating and informative display of cars, mainly from the '60s, '70s and '80s.









The seemingly endless rooms, packed wall to wall with cars, motorcycles and automobilia brought back fond memories for everyone with plenty of comments such as: 'I used to have one of those' and 'My parents had one of those when I was a child'.

For MG fans the disappointment was that the museum contains just one example of the marque, an MG Midget, while Fords were to be found in abundance.

Patrick himself was on hand to chat to club members and all his volunteers were very friendly and well informed.

Those who took the opportunity to taste the refreshments in the café was very complimentary about the standard of the food and the quick and efficient service.

Replete with food for the body and food for the soul everyone was back on the coach for the 45 minute journey to the 16th century Perry's Cider Farm where we had almost exclusive access to the shop and café and a chance, between showers, to look at the farm exhibits.

MG to launch new prestige brand

MG's Chinese owners have announced plans to launch a new premium brand focusing on high end battery electric vehicles.

The cars will be launched under the IM brand name which stands for Intelligent Mobility and promises to explore new technologies and to deliver an exciting driving experience.

Due to be available in Europe in 2025, IM models, say executives, will be defined by a clear commitment to the use of advanced technology in driving assistance and controls, intelligent and connected services for customers as well as leading-edge EV powertrains.

The first models to be launched will be cutting-edge SUVs and saloons, the LS6 and L6 - the latter was given its global debut at the recent Geneva Motor Show.

The sleek looking all-electric L6 saloon (see right) combines a zero to100 km/h sprint time of under 3 seconds with a potential range of over 600 kilometres (Lithium-ion battery) and 800 kilometres (solid state battery) in two different specifications.

The IM L6 was unveiled at the Geneva show alongside the allnew MG3 Hybrid+ (see separate story) and the latest version of the Cyberster convertible which is set to go on sale here this summer.



The Cyberster promises 0-62mph in 3.2 seconds with a maximum power output of the dual motor version at 544PS (400kW) and maximum torque of 535 lb ft (725 NM). The single motor Cyberster will deliver power figures of 340PS (250kW) with the maximum torque available confirmed at 350 lb ft (475 NM). The 0-62mph sprint time will be 5.2 seconds.

Also on the stand at Geneva were the MG4 EV XPOWER as well as two models from the company's international portfolio, the fastback MG7 saloon and the all-electric MG9 saloon.

Line Dancing got people up on their feet

Things got energetic at last month's club night when a large proportion of the attendees took to the floor for a demonstration of Line Dancing.

It was very satisfying to see so much audience participation and all without a slipped disc in sight.

Our special guest tutor was Line Dancing teacher Annette Maidment (thanks to club member Sara Runciman for organising this) who gently explained each step and then combined them into one complete dance sequence before getting everyone instep to the music.

At the end of the evening Annette generously donated her normal tuition fee to Macmillan Caring Locally, one of the club's designated charities.



Donington Historic Festival

The 2024 Donington Historic Festival takes place on 04-05 May and features a wide range of competition cars including some more than 100 years old contesting the 'Mad Jack' for Pre-War Sports Cars, which will see behemoth Bentleys wheel-towheel with powerful Bugattis, Aston Martins and Frazer-Nashes and giant-killing Morgans in a grid which echoes the very earliest days of racing at Donington Park.

The grid for the Royal Automobile Club Woodcote Trophy for pre-56 sportscars and Stirling Moss Trophy for pre-61 sports racers brings together the likes of Jaguar D-types and Maserati 250S, Lotus XI and XVs, Lister Jaguar Knobblies, Lola Mk 1s, Austin-Healey 100Ms and Cooper T39 Bobtails.

The three-hour Royal Automobile Club Pall Mall Cup features pre-66 GT and Touring Cars, with categories for pre-63GTs and pre-61 Sports Cars.

The Superformance Ferrari Club Classic has classes for roadlegal and modified Ferraris up to the era of the 355 Challenge, including 308, 328, 348, 355, 456, 550, Mondial and more!

The festival is always a jamboree for touring car fans including the Jack Sears Trophy for 1958-1966 tin-tops where the

thundering V8 Falcons, Mustangs and Galaxies are harried by nimble Lotus Cortinas, Alfa GTAs and pesky Mini Coopers, and not to be ruled out are the evocative '50s racers, with powerful Austin Westminsters, racy Austin A35s and A40s plus a myriad of near-forgotten models such as Riley 1.5s and Standard Tens.

The combined HRDC Dunlop Allstars for pre-66 Sports, GT & Touring Cars and HRDC Classic Alfa Challenge for 750-116 Alfa Romeos is always entertaining.

Motor Racing Legends Historic Touring Car Trophy and Tony Dron Trophy with Sixties Touring Car Challenge with U2TC encompasses three decades of Touring Cars in one massive grid. Lotus Cortinas, Mini Coopers, Alfa Romeo GTAs, Rover SD1s and Ford Capris share the circuit with flame-spitting Sierra Cosworth RS500s, BMW E36 M3s and Nissan Skylines.

The HRDC Gerry Marshall Trophy for pre-83 Gp.1 and Gp.1½ Touring Cars sees V8 Rovers stave off the 3-litre Capris, while Triumph Dolomites pitch battle with Ford Escorts, 1275GT Minis and rarities such as Opel Commodores.

New MG3 Hybrid coming to the UK

MG has taken the wraps of an all-new hybrid version of its main-stream MG3 hatchback - it made its global premiere at the Geneva Motor Show.

Designed by MG's Shanghai studio, the all-new MG3 is both longer and wider than the model it replaces and claims best-inclass interior equipment and space including the largest boot in the hybrid B-segment.

The all-new MG3 features larger battery, a 75kW (102PS) 1.5litre petrol engine and a 100kW (136PS) electric motor, as well as separate generator motor which enables a wide variety of powertrain operating modes.

This includes: EV - running on electric-only power for as long as charge allows, Series - engine runs through to the generator, which powers the electric motor for drive, Series and Charge series driving, plus topping-up the battery when under low-load, Drive and Charge - engine drives the wheels, while also charging the battery through the generator and Parallel - both engine and electric motor power the wheels.



MG claims that the Hybrid+ powertrain will make the MG3 the fastest accelerating hybrid B-segment model in the class, with a 0 to 62mph sprint time of 8.0 seconds while accelerating from 50 to75mph can be achieved in 5.0 seconds.

Producing a combined 143kW, the MG3 Hybrid+ returns economy figures of 64mpg and 100g/km CO2 emissions. This is aided by a 1.83kWh battery, allowing for an extensive electriconly driving range - significantly boosting efficiency.



The engine is connected to a three-speed automatic transmission with the choice of three driving modes - Eco, Standard, and Sport. Eco mode is calibrated for optimum fuel economy and provides gentle throttle response for drivers, while Standard provides a blend between economy and performance, and works well for most trip types. Sport sees a more responsive calibration delivering some of the best performance figures in the hybrid supermini class.



MG's engineers in Europe and China have worked on finetuning the chassis and suspension for different markets with the use of new ultra-high stiffness components in the chassis, while suspension elements have been designed to reduce weight and improve grip for both athletic handling and a comfortable ride.

The all-new MG3 will be offered in two specifications for UK customers - SE and Trophy.



The MG Hybrid+ SE starts from £18,495 OTR with the more generously equipped Trophy model available from £20,495 OTR. MG offers both with a seven-year/80,000-mile warranty.

Both models come with dual screen technology (drivers have a 7-inch digital instrument screen, as well as a 10.25-inch central infotainment system), 16-inch alloy wheels, satellite navigation, Apple CarPlay/Android Auto, MG Pilot and a reversing camera. MG Pilot Safety includes Autonomous Emergency Braking (AEB), Front Collision Warning (FCW), Lane Departure Warning (LDW), Emergency Lane Keep Assist (LKAS) and Adaptive Cruise Control.

The Trophy MG3 Hybrid+ adds in a 360° camera, heated front seats and steering wheel, keyless entry, privacy glass, rain sensing wipers and LED projector headlights.



Havill collection goes under the hammer

Three cars from the collection of 1020 club member Patrick Havill who died last year, appear in this month's SWVA classic sale at Holton Heath Trading Park on Thursday 25 April.

These include Patrick's Metallic Almond Green 1951 MG TD (Lot 37) - right - which he re-acquired in February 2019, having previously owned the car in the late 1950s and early 1960s.

It was particularly significant for Patrick as it was the car in which in 1962 he won his first motorsport speed event and he was a regular with it at Classic Cars on Christchurch Quay.

Under a previous owner it underwent a restoration in 1983 and features modifications such as an uprated differential, Mota-Lita steering wheel, luggage rack and aero screens.

Despite having a 2019 insurance valuation of $\pm 25,000$ the TD is listed with a guide price of only $\pm 8,000$ to $\pm 9,000$ which reflects its competition history but still seems like a bargain.

Also from Patrick's collection is his 1988 Caterham 7 Race Car (Lot 47) in which he competed at circuits in the UK and Europe. The history file features invoices totalling £16,500 including uprated race brakes in 2001 plus an engine upgrade in 2018 to a new 2289cc Vauxhall unit. An ideal track day car it has an estimate of £9,000-£10,000.

The third car is his 2004 Ferrari 360 Spider (Lot 70) finished in Ferrari Rosso over a luxurious Crema leather interior. It shows a warranted 33,000 miles from new and is expected to attract bids close to £50,000.



Elsewhere in the sale a notable MG is a maroon coachwork 1939 MG TA Sports (Lot 65) which was imported back into the UK in 2010 having been originally sold to the United States. The £18,000-£20,000 guide looks about right.

A 1972 MG Midget (Lot 35) in the ever-popular Blaze Red, comes with invoices totalling almost £8,000 for various parts and labour expenses and shows 16,778 miles on the clock. It has a punchy estimate of £6,500-£7,500.

By comparison a clean looking Damask Red 1974 MG Midget (Lot 27) that was previously bought in September 2004 for $\pounds4,300$ looks like a bargain at $\pounds1,500-\pounds2,000$.

The sale starts at 10am on 25 April with viewing during the week before.

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
