Verwood Rustic Fayre

Interest has been expressed in the club taking part in the Verwood Rustic Fayre on the August Bank Holiday Monday; this would involve a short convoy run to allow everyone to be parked together as a group.

The organisers have changed the arrangements for vehicle displays at Potterne Park this year and are no longer offering individual club display spaces at a set fee. Instead, they will be charging individual owners £7.50 per car which has to be booked in advance and then parking cars as they arrive.

MG100 Cavalcade

A year of national celebrations to mark 100 years since the creation of the MG marque are set to conclude this month with a John O'Groats to Land's End Cavalcade.

This takes place between Tuesday 30 April and Saturday 25 May and is being organised by the MG Car Club and includes a stop over at the National Motor Museum in the New Forest.

The first leg travels from John O'Groats to Inverness and then south through Scotland with a hop across to Northern Ireland (03-05 May) before returning to England journeying from Carlisle to Durham, Harrogate, Hull, and Stockport before stopping at Longbridge (14 May), Gaydon (15 May) and Abingdon (16 May). It then becomes part of the MG100 event at Brooklands (18-19 May) prior to transferring to the National Motor Museum at Beaulieu (21 May) via Petersfield and Winchester.

The south-west leg starts on 22 May and travels from Beaulieu (after a full day at the museum and its attractions) to Salisbury and up to Warminster eventually heading for Bristol, Weston-Super-Mare, Exeter and, finally, arriving at Land's End on Saturday 25 May.

Our big day out at Athelhampton House

Put the date in your diary now . . Sunday 18 August 2024.

This is our annual 1020 Garden Party and Picnic at Athelhampton House near Dorchester when we invite MG owners from across the region to join us. It is also our major fund-raising activity of the year for our charities Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance and Macmillan Caring Locally.

The entry fees have been held at the 2023 prices - this means it will be £10 per person if booked in advance or £12 per person on the day. This gives admission to the event and the Athelhampton gardens.

Participants will also be able to tour the house, which now has more rooms open including a period bedroom and a new Athelhampton archive display for a discounted £5 per person on presentation of the event programme.

Athelhampton House is Britain's first carbon neutral manor house following the installation of an array of solar panels and ground heat source pumps which has significantly reduced their energy consumption from the national grid.





Those who are interested in the technology can join an Eco Tour on the day given by general manager Owen Davies - this needs to be booked in advance via the Athelhampton website.

On the rear lawns we will have our usual selection of stands including the grand tombola, rolling wine draw, jigsaws sales and name the dog.

Volunteers will be needed to staff the welcome gate, organise the parking and supervise the stalls.

Synthetic fuels top classic alternatives

Synthetic fuels are the favoured zero-emission alternative for over three-quarters of classic and collector car owners, according to a survey by classic insurance specialists.

It asked owners: 'How do you think you would power your classic / collectable car if petrol or diesel wasn't available?' and 76 per cent voted for synthetic fuels, and the other 24 per cent thought they would convert their classic / collectable car to run on electric power.



Synthetic fuels, or e-fuels, are made from bio waste, itself being a product of biological organisms such as plankton and algae that absorbed energy from the sun millions of years ago, or other synthetic CO2-neutral masses. Not only are they less harmful to create, i.e. not using oil-based raw materials to make the fuel, but when synthetic fuels are burned, they also produce fewer harmful emissions.

While some large vehicle manufacturers are investing in synthetic fuels, it's widely reported that synthetic fuels may be one alternative way to power vehicles that have already been made and, due to the petrol pump infrastructure already in place, work best for classic or performance vehicles. The results came from a poll during a Historic and Classic Vehicles Alliance (HCVA) meeting.

"This is a fascinating question, and one that we are often asked," commented chief executive of the HCVA, Garry Wilson.

"The reality is that if people want to keep running their classics on petrol, there will be plenty available for several decades to come. My main message is don't panic. Most of us will not have to make this difficult decision."

Expanding on the question, Wilson believes it's very much a personal decision. "Some classics are deeply impressive converted to electric, but do it because you like how they drive, not because you think you are contributing to saving the planet, which you won't be unless you drive it enough miles to recover the CO2 spike caused by battery manufacture," he emphasises.

"Sustainable fuels are a drop-in solution that, when they become widely available, we can all use without any modifications to our engines, slashing our carbon emissions immediately to 80 per cent of net-zero. That's a huge environmental win that also protects the character of classics."

Managing director of Footman James, David Bond said: "I am pleased to hear owners are thinking about the future and how they may be able to align their classic cars with a net-zero future.

"Understanding the power that alternative fuels have for our classic and collector car industry, shows not only a potential positive outlook ahead, but also highlights to organisations the power that e-fuels have to secure ICE cars' relevance and sustainability in the future.

"After all, if we can keep more cars on the road rather than manufacturing new, that will save millions of tonnes of embedded carbon."

Spring Road Run

1020 marked National Drive It Day with a Spring Road Run and Pub Lunch that started with coffee and cakes at the Sammy Miller Museum before heading into the picturesque New Forest with its colourful mix of flora and fauna.

The scenic 46-mile road route was tackled by 21 club cars ranging from an early TA through to a modern all-electric MG4 and, while MGBs dominated as usual, there was also a TD, MGA, RV8, ZS, MGTF, MGF and MGC and a pair of MGB V8s.

The route took participants through Sway, Brockenhurst, Beaulieu and Exbury to Lepe (with views across to the Isle of Wight) and then back via Lymington and Milford-on-Sea before 42 people sat down for a roast lunch at The Amberwood pub at Walkford.

Win an MGB GT

The National Motor Museum is offering visitors the opportunity to win a classic British Racing Green 1972 MGB GT in its annual prize draw.

In the past the draws have featured a brand-new car, but this time they are trying something different.

The car (which features a full black leather interior with uprated walnut dashboard) is powered by a standard 1.8 litre Bseries engine with a four-speed gearbox and overdrive plus the addition of electric power steering. It has been restored using a BMH Heritage bodyshell by MilestonesClassics.

This time there is an alternative £10,000 cash prize. Second prize is a seat in one of the National Motor Museum's historic vehicles on the London to Brighton Run 2025 (with accommodation in London).

Third prize is a trip for three around the New Forest in a vehicle from the Museum Collection and a chocolate treat from the Beaulieu Chocolate Studio.

National Motor Museum re-vamp

The National Motor Museum has landed a £226,000 grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund to finance a major refurbishment programme that includes transforming the entrance and welcome desk and creating a new gallery.

Displays will explain the origins of the museum and its direct connections to the pioneers of motoring while the main gallery space will display a new permanent exhibition 'The Ages of Motoring'.



This will showcase the development and social history of cars and motorcycles from the 19th century, through 20th century and beyond.

Preparation work for the changes has already begun with the installation of new automatic doors at the museum entrance while the overhead canopy has been painted in its original orange colour scheme.

Jon Murden, Chief Executive of the National Motor Museum says: "The funding will enable the museum to develop new and imaginative ways of sharing the story of motoring through our collections, demonstrating the way motoring affects the lives of almost everybody and shapes society, showcasing the past, present and future of motoring."

The heritage fund grant will also support the museum's Learning Team. The two-year project will see the museum collaborate with local community groups and will explore motoring themes relevant to contemporary audiences and address gaps in representation within the collections.

Interior make-over

If you are planning to re-upholster your MG in the near future, club member Ian Hanstead recommends checking-out the services provided by local specialists Rawhide Upholsters at Ferndown.

Ian relates his recent experience of having the seats of his MG RV8 re-trimmed . . .

'It all started last year on our club's Pride of Ownership night when I asked Wayne Healey (car valeter and event sponsor) for some advice on cleaning up the leather seats in my RV8.

After a short trial on the leather, he advised that the seats had 'seen better days' - very dried out and in places small tears had started. He suggested replacement seat covers was the better option, or advised I contact Rawhide Upholsterers at Cobham Road on the Ferndown Industrial Estate.

I checked out the price for replacement seat covers including headrests from Clive Wheatley MGV8 specialists - - not cheap! And I would have to do the replacement too.

As a result, I popped down to Rawhide and met James who runs the unit. He advised he could do bespoke identical replacements in leather and vinyl to match, replace any rotten foam, and recover the two rear internal panels which are no longer available, from the surplus vinyl.

The total job worked out cheaper too!

He showed me the current job he had just completed which was replacing the seats in a TR6 - I couldn't fault his work, so I booked my car in.

Upon collection, what a difference, and what a good job. I am certainly pleased with the results - much better than I could do! And because there was some leather left over, he replaced the gaiters to the gearstick and handbrake for nothing - bonus!

Now, the rest of the interior was put to shame, so I asked for a quote to replace the carpets, panels to the door (including releathering the door arm rests) and front kick sides, replace the leather centre console arm rest and change the vinyl to leather on the console.


