FIRST CCOTO RAINED OFF

The opening classic car gathering of the year at Christchurch Quay was cancelled last month (Monday 21 April) due to an adverse weather forecast.

In the event the rain was not as severe as had been forecast but the organisers had to make the decision 24 hours in advance - the arrangement with BCP Council is that the meetings on the Quomps will not go ahead if there has been rain during the 48 hours prior to the events or is forecast for the day of the event.

This is due to the nature of the ground which is susceptible to flooding and where the grass when wet can be severely damaged by vehicles.

The forecast for this coming Bank Holiday Monday (05 May) is wall-to-wall sunshine so it is looking good to get our cars back on the Quay.

May club night - Life in the Left Lane

To mark the 90th anniversary of the introduction of the UK Driving Test our guest speaker at this month's club night will be Clive St James Greenaway who for many years was a senior driving instructor in Bournemouth.

He will be giving a talk called 'Life In the Left Lane' which is a 45-minute fun-filled recollection of his life as a driving instructor packed with humorous anecdotes.

He will also include a short 10 minute section on how to cope with road rage using 'laughter yoga'!

Voluntary testing in Britain was introduced on 16 March 1935 by the Road Traffic Act 1934 - a Mr R Beere was the first person to pass the driving test which at the time cost 7s 6d (37.5p).

Compulsory testing was brought in on 1 June 1935 for all drivers and riders who started driving on or after 01 April 1934. Around 246,000 candidates applied immediately and initially between nine and 16 half-hour tests were conducted each day by 250 examiners. In the first year the pass rate was 63 per cent.

To check how well club members would get on if they had to pass the driving test today, Clive's speech will be followed by a short quiz based on the current Highway Code with a prize for the winning team.



The meeting will conclude with the regular monthly raffle (tickets from Jackie Cherrett) - prizes always welcome. Proceeds from the raffle help to pay the cost of hiring the meeting room.

Also at club night, you will be able to sign-up for the Summer Road Run and BBQ on 29 June and book a place at the various car shows that 1020 will be participating in this summer.

At Pamphill Hall participants will be served a freshly cooked BBQ featuring a selection of meats (vegetarian options), salads as well as the choice of tea or coffee and ice creams for dessert.

Entry fee for the run is £5 per car to include the route book and a rally plaque. The BBQ and Ice Cream costs £18 per head - which must also be paid in full at the time of booking.

Verwood Rustic Fayre Car Show

The TR Register Wessex Group (which includes some 1020 club members) will be organising the Classic Vehicle Show at this year's Verwood Rotary Rustic Fayre at Potterne Park on Bank Holiday Monday 25 August.

The show is open to pre-1984 registered vehicles and the booking fee this year is £7 which includes entry for the vehicle and driver with one passenger (£7 for each additional passenger payable on the day), plus a Verwood Fayre programme.

For the first time, all applications can be made on line through a dedicated on-line booking page.

Exhibitors are asked to arrive between 9am and 11.30am on the day (tickets must be shown on the gate) to be in place for the Grand Opening at 12noon, they are then expected to stay until 4:30pm due to site health and safety requirements.

Extra places available for STEAM museum

Due to a late surge in ticket sales a larger coach has now been booked for the 1020 coach trip on Thursday 15 May which is visiting the Museum of the Great Western Railway (STEAM) at Swindon and the adjoining Swindon Designer Outlet shopping retail centre.

This means that there are additional seats available for anyone who missed out on the original allocation of places.

The coach will be leaving Hamworthy Sports Club at 9am prompt and should arrive at Swindon by 11.30am before departing at 3pm for the return journey allowing over three hours to tour the museum, visit the café and window shop in the designer outlet which is housed in the same complex.

Entry fee is £30 to include a seat on the coach and discounted entry to the museum. Alternatively, a seat on the coach for those preferring to go shopping, is £20.

STEAM is housed in a restored Grade II railway building in the heart of the former Swindon railway works and tells the story of the men and women who built, operated and travelled on the Great Western Railway.

The museum contains a wide range of artifacts including famous GWR locomotives, imaginative story-telling displays, videos - mixing rare archive film footage with the stories of exrailway workers.



There are also hands-on exhibits, interactive displays and many rare GWR items of memorabilia.

There is a café on Platform One that offers a selection of hot and cold drinks, plus homemade cakes and sandwiches.

Next door is the McArthurGlen's Swindon Designer Outlet which is one of the largest covered designer outlets in Europe featuring a mix of high street and designer brands.

MGB Roadster prize in Beaulieu draw

Having offered a 1972 MGB GT as the prize in their most recent annual prize raffle which was drawn last month, the National Motor Museum Trust is sticking with MG and with 1972 for their 2025 fund raiser.

Top prize in the 2025 draw is this 1972 MGB Roadster that comes complete with 12 months servicing, breakdown cover and a voucher for classic insurance with Hagerty.



A £10,000 alternative first prize is available.

The Roadster is powered by a 1.8 litre B-series engine and has a four-speed gearbox with overdrive. It has been fully restored and comes with the addition of electric power steering and features a black vinyl interior.

Second prize is the opportunity to have a seat in one of the National Motor Museum's historic vehicles on the London to Brighton Veteran Car Run 2026. The prize includes accommodation in London for one night.

Third prize is a trip for three around the New Forest in a vehicle from the Museum Collection and a chocolate treat from the Beaulieu Chocolate Studio.

A few people also took the opportunity to purchase some spare parts for their own vehicles from John's extensive stores.


The workshop cars were matched by the colourful and diverse collection of MGs brought out by club members for the day; these ranged from a 1950s MGA through a healthy contingent of MGBs and MGB GTs, a brace of MGCs and a MGB V8 (Regional Secretary Nigel Knowles) and onto more modern machinery such as a ZS hatchback, RV8 Roadster, MGFs and TFs right up to an all-electric MG4.

It was especially pleasing to see Colin Sexton's award-winning MGB GT which had been brought along by his son William who we hope to see on more club events.

After the refreshments and insight into the workshop, rally plates and road books were issued by Adrian and Rita Mullins providing the instructions for a gentle drive to Potterne Park at Verwood with an alternative finish section for those who were going onto the Winchester MGOC Cobweb Spin at the Dorset Heavy Horse Farm.

In perfect, blue sky, driving conditions the modest 31-mile route took participants on a tour to the west and then north of Wimborne using some of the lesser travelled country roads.

At the finish, everyone went their separate ways, some choosing to make use of the local pubs and cafes for lunch.

Winchester MGOC Cobweb Spin

Our close neighbours at Winchester MGOC hosted their traditional Cobweb Spin event on National Drive It Day at the Verwood Heavy Horse Farm near Verwood - the event location coincided with the finish point of the 1020 Spring Road Run to allow club members to take part in both activities.

Winchester had enough advance bookings to give MG owners exclusive access to the nationally recognised horse centre - the car park being crammed with a diverse collection of MGs from a TD through to a brand new MG3 Hybrid+.

The farm, one of the last to specialise in heavy horses, is home to over 20 horses (of various breeds) - many of which have been rescued - they are responsible for the purchase, ongoing care and medical treatment required for all the horses.

The farm also provides sanctuary to many other farmyard friends including donkeys, alpacas, turkeys, chickens, rabbits, guinea pigs, ducks, pigs, ferrets and aviary birds.

Alongside the animals, the farm displays a variety of agricultural vehicles and farm machinery including a rare vintage truck collection and road construction display, Showman's living wagons, a section on traditional Romany life, a blacksmith's workshop, a static canal display (with an insight into the horses that worked on water), a reconstruction of the Grains Hill Colliery (home to pit ponies) and a mechanical horse and vintage cider press display.













Beaulieu Spring Autojumble

The ever popular Beaulieu Spring Autojumble takes place on Saturday 17 and Sunday 18 May offering a one-stop-shopping experience for all your classic motoring needs especially those seeking an elusive part for their historic vehicle project, or those simply wanting a motoring-themed day out.

The contents of hundreds of garages, sheds, lock-ups and lofts will be on sale spread across hundreds of stalls.

On the Sunday there is the return of Trunk Traders, which is ideal for anyone looking to sell off their surplus motoring paraphernalia and it is also the home of the Land Rover Rummage providing the opportunity for fans of the iconic 4X4, to find spare parts, accessories and even complete project vehicles.

If you after a complete car, dozens will be found in the Automart ranging from familiar classics to modern road cars.

Alongside the sales area, our friends at the Dorset Branch of the Morris Minor Owners Club will return with MoggyFest featuring up to 200 Morris Minors in a themed display called 'Morris Through the Decades'.

This year, they will be hosting talks featuring informal sessions with key figures in the motoring scene, such as Steph Holloway from 'I Drive a Classic' and Poole motoring journalist Kim Henson, creator of the website 'Wheels Alive'.



To celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Sprite brand there will be a special display of colourful, vintage Sprite caravans that were popular from the 1950s to the 1980s due to their affordability, practicality and reputation.

We Had One of Those

A new interactive exhibition at Beaulieu will take more mature drivers back to some of the most popular cars from their childhood with iconic vehicles from the '60s, '70s, '80s, '90s and noughties on display.



'We Had One of Those' is designed to allow motoring enthusiasts old and new to get up-close and personal with some familiar names from the past by opening the doors, sitting inside, marvelling at retro dashboards and interacting with their buttons and dials.



Located adjacent to the National Motor Museum in the position previously occupied by the Top Gear exhibition, the new attraction features 10 vehicles including a 1960s VW Beetle, the infamous Austin Allegro (see left) - fondly remembered as the car everyone loved to hate in the 1970s - a Vauxhall Cavalier representing the 1980s (see below), and the big-selling Ford Fiesta, the first car for so many in the 1990s.

The cars are surrounded by popular items, sounds and accessories to transport you back to those years and evoke fond memories of past motoring decades



From fluffy dice hanging in the windscreen of the Austin Allegro to beaded seats in the Vauxhall Cavalier, you'll remember the 'good old days' in new ways.

The new 'We Had One of Those' attraction is included in the general admission ticket to Beaulieu, which also covers entry to the National Motor Museum, Palace House, Beaulieu Abbey, On Screen Cars, Little Beaulieu adventure play area and rides on the Monorail.

MGs galore in SWVA Spring Sale

A bumper array of no less than 15 MGs of varying ages went under the hammer at last month's classic sale organised by South Western Vehicle Auctions at Holton Heath.

All found new owners and almost all of them either sold between their estimates or exceeded them.

Top performer against estimate was a 1971 MGB GT that had been listed for between £4,000 and £5,000 but reached a healthy £7,650 (before fees).

Also exceeding expectations was a rare 1975 MGB GT Jubilee that finally went for £5,800 against a conservative original reserve of £4,000.

There was also a lot of interest in an extremely rare 1968 MG1300 in white that had a very modest catalogue guide of £1,000 to £2,000 which was quickly surpassed and eventually went for £3,400.

An early 1964 MGB Roadster that had a bullish estimate of £8,000 to £10,000 almost made its top end but at £9,500 was still the second highest priced MG in the sale.

Top honour went to a 1968 MGC which surprisingly struggled to get over its £9,000 bottom estimate and was knocked down for £9,850 which seemed like the deal of the day.

Roadsters in general did well, a 1969 MGB that had a £5,000 reserve just slid over the line at £5,150 while the best performing MGB GT was a 1975 example in yellow that made £5,050.

A 1977 MGB GT example finished in Carmine red featuring lots of recent work just exceeded its reserve at £3,300 which was the same final bid as on an earlier 1973 chrome bumper version finished in striking bright green (see photo).



Selling for £4,500 (£500 above top estimate) was another MGB GT, this time a 1973 example finished in Harvest Gold over a black leather interior with a lowly 50,600 miles on the clock.

Despite being a non-runner, a 1972 MGB Roadster with a long one family history and 97,277 genuine miles was attractive enough for someone to pay £3,800 .

Both the MG Midgets in the sale found new homes at above their guide prices, a restored 1972 round wheel arch, chrome bumper example in black easily surpassed its £3,500 reserve to go for £4,050 while a red 1500cc Midget from 1976 just dipped over its £4,500 estimate at £5,000.

Also appearing in the sale were a pair of MGFs, a 2000 year SE with an average guide of £1,200 did well to reach £1,400 while a year later example just slipped below its top estimate at £2,300.


