Chairman's Chat - August 2025

There are now just days left before our big annual event - our **Garden Party and Picnic at Athelhampton House** which takes place on **Sunday 10 August**.

This is our major fund-raising and social activity and, at the time of writing, we have approaching 100 cars pre-booked. If you haven't already completed your entry form and paid your money for Athelhampton remember only those who pre-book are guaranteed a place on the rear lawn.

Advance entries at the £12 per head discounted price close on Friday 01 August so there isn't much time remaining.

Because there is such a lot to do on the day, from greeting fellow MG enthusiasts as they arrive, handing out programmes and goodie bags, taking on-the-day payments, directing individual club cars to their designated parking areas and manning the various stalls, I shall be asking every club member in attendance to undertake some duty during the day.



Entry forms are still available via the club website - advance entry fee is £12 per person, but remember pre-booking closes on Friday 01 August (more details later in this newsletter) or £15 on the day.

Richard 'Dick' Jolly

As everyone should already be aware, long standing 1020 member Richard 'Dick' Jolly died last month after a short battle with cancer and his funeral is set to take place on Saturday 16 August at 2.30pm at the Harbour View Crematorium, Randalls Hill, Lytchett Minster, Poole BH16 6AN. It will be followed by a wake at the same venue.

Dick was a well-respected and popular club member who was a regular at club nights, coach trips and car shows. He also organised and ran a very successful series of road runs (Jolly Runs) for the club about two decades ago.



Many will remember that for a period Dick was the custodian and regular driver to car shows of Patrick Cooke's red MGB Roadster which had appeared in the feature film Sleuth driven by Michael Caine. Latterly Dick used his own Austin Healey 1000 on club road runs and to take part in car shows.

As well as being a member of 1020, Dick was also a member of the Dorset Jaguar Enthusiasts Club, Poole Bay Classics and the Dorset Midget and Sprite Club, so was widely known in the local classic car world - a large number of people are expected to attend the funeral.

There will also be representatives from Dorset Police as he was originally in the force and served as a motorcycle rider. His second career as a registrar saw him marry many local couples including at least one of these being club members.

Another of his interests was as an observer for the Institute of Advanced Motorists so a few of his colleagues from the IAM will be in attendance.

Any club members who has not already told Chris Adamson that they plan to attend the funeral and wake are asked to contact Chris at club night so that he can advise Dick's family of likely numbers for the catering.

Autumn Road Run and Aviation Museum

The Boscombe Down Aviation Collection at Old Sarum airfield on the outskirts of Salisbury will be the destination for the 1020 Autumn Road Run on Sunday 12 October.

Starting point will be the Sammy Miller Motorcycle Museum at Bashley (near New Milton) where Sammy's Pit Stop café will be serving teas and coffees from 9.30am with the option of a breakfast roll (bacon, sausage, egg or veggie) with a hot drink at the special discounted price of £7.50p.

Cars will then set off on a road route heading due north through the New Forest using lesser-travelled roads before reaching Old Sarum airfield where we will have reserved parking outside the aviation collection.



Participants will then have the option of going straight into the museum where we have arranged discounted admission of £10 per head or have lunch at the newly installed Hanger 3 café.

Members will recall that the original Hanger 3 restaurant was destroyed in a fire earlier this year but since then new temporary kitchens, bar, toilets and undercover seating have been installed prior to a complete rebuild due to start in two years time.

We will be arranging a special menu selection for those who want to have lunch. There is also the option of a pre or post lunch drink at the adjacent Dark Revolution micro-brewery.

True Lovers Knot Vintage Rally

Club members are being invited to take their MGs along to the True Lovers Knot Family Fun Day and Vintage Rally, which is being held over this month's Bank Holiday weekend (23, 24, and 25 August) at Tarrant Keyneston.

There is no age limit for exhibits and entry is free. The show will begin at 12noon each day with exhibitors being asked to be fully set up and ready by 11.30am.

This is the second year the event has been staged, last year it raised £2,500 for Friends of Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), a registered charity that supports critically ill children and their families at Southampton Children's Hospital.

Athelhampton - Our Big Day Out



By the time you receive this newsletter there will be just a few days remaining to get your advance lower price entry in for our Annual Garden Party and Picnic on Sunday 10 August at Athelhampton House and Gardens.

Advance booking fee is £12 per person - entry forms are available from Chris Adamson at chris@1020mg.org.uk or one can be downloaded from the diary section of the 1020 website - see 10 August entry on the home page.

Pre-booking provides direct entry to the event, access to the gardens, reserved parking on the rear lawn, access to the licensed restaurant café, a free event programme, discounted admission to the Elizabethan House and, for the first 70 cars to arrive on the day, a free goodie bag.

The day features regional MGOC club displays, trade stands, summer hamper draw, tombola, a rolling wine raffle, jigsaw sales, a silent auction and, new for 2025, a cake stall. This year we have guests attending from Dorset Triumph TR Register and the Dorset Jaguar Enthusiasts Club.

All proceeds from the day are going to our nominated charities: Dorset & Somerset Air Ambulance and Macmillan Caring Locally.

Gates open at 10am (volunteers can arrive from 8am). Competition presentations take place at 2pm and the day finishes around 4pm when the gates will close.

Setting-up of the relevant event shelters, parking signs and club banners will take place on the day before at 3pm - volunteers to assist will be required.

Advance entries close on Friday 01 August. On-the-day admission for those not pre-booked will be £15 per person but this does not guarantee reserved parking on the lawn.

ATHELHAMPTON DAY - HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CLUB

Saturday Set-up:

We need volunteers to come along to Athelhampton the day before our event to help erect the various stand gazebos, club signs and mark out the parking areas for the various visiting clubs.

If you can spare some time please get there for 3pm - the more helpers the quicker things will get done.

Volunteers on the day:

Club members will be needed to staff the various stalls, welcome cars as they arrive and marshal the parking on the rear lawn. Volunteers for the morning duties are asked to be there as soon after 8am as possible.

It is hoped that every club member attending the day will do their bit to help spread the workload. Chris Adamson will be assigning tasks at the August club night or contacting people by email to ask them to take on either a morning or afternoon assignment.

If there is a particular duty you would prefer (either helping-out on a stand, welcoming arrivals and handing out programmes and goodie bags or with the parking) please let Chris know.

Tombola prizes:

We need suitable prizes in advance (not on the day) for the Grand Tombola which is our biggest fund-raising activity of the day. Items can be handed to Patricia Lodge at the August club night. All the prizes are pre-ticketed in advance.

Cake stall:

Calling all home bakers - this year for the first time we will have a cake stall to help boost income. If you can bake a suitable cake (ideally ones that can be easily cut into portions as we plan to sell them by the slice rather than whole cakes) please let Patricia Lodge know so that we can check who is bringing which flavour. We are trying to be able to offer a variety of cake rather than everyone baking the same.

You will also need to supply a list of ingredients for each cake so that those who have dietary requirements can check they are not allergic to any ingredient.

Jigsaw sales:

One of the most popular stands at the Athelhampton day is always the one selling jigsaws - if you have any clean and complete jigsaws you would like to donate please hand them to Patricia Lodge or Chris Adamson at the August club night.

We headed south to the village of Apperley and then turned north to skirt Corse Lawn. We then passed through Twynning and Stensham where we saw a radio telescope that forms part of the six linked observatories forming Jodrell Bank Merlin.



On past Elmley Castle where Queen Elizabeth I stayed and then through Broadway, a quintessential Cotswold village. Passing Snowhill Manor which was the unconventional home of the eccentric Charles Wade.

Then we parked at the famous folly, Broadway Tower and entered the café for lunch.

The second half of the run passed Dover hill which is the home of the Cotswold Olympics which hosts events such as Shin Kicking, a sport that goes back to 1612.

Passing through more villages we eventually passed Stanway House, famous for its gravity fed 300 foot fountain which is the tallest in the world.

Back to the rugby club and we were lucky enough to win a prize in the raffle - which you may see in the tombola at Athelhampton.'

Inaugural New Forest Car Show

Next coach trip to visit D-Day Story

Details are due to be announced shortly for the next 1020 Coach Trip which is being planned for November and will be heading to the D-Day Museum at Portsmouth with the option of a stop at Gunwharf Quays shopping centre.

The trip is being organised by committee member Alasdair Wellwood and will start at Hamworthy Sports Club at 9am. The coach will first drop off anyone who only wants to visit Gunwharf Quays before proceeding to the D-Day Story at Southsea where club members will have over three hours to tour the attraction.

Participants should note that the two venues are not within easy walking distance of each other.

The museum tells the story of the liberation of Europe from Nazi Germany occupation. It is told using the personal possessions and words of the people who took part. It includes audio-visual presentations, authentic vehicles and hands-on interactives which help to bring the story to life.

The story is told in four parts beginning on board Landing Craft Tank 7074 - the last surviving LCT from D-Day. Next, is the Preparation galleries, to learn more about the planning that went into the operation. D-Day and the Battle of Normandy follows - taking you back to 06 June.



Finally, the tour reaches the Legacy gallery and Overlord Embroidery, to see the colourful and emotive stitched panels that tell the full story of D-Day.

Costs are likely to be £30 for a coach seat and museum entry, or £17 for just a seat on the coach stopping at Gunwharf Quays. More details and booking forms next month.

All things MG at Discount MG Rover Day

New Forest parts specialist, Discount MG Rover, who were the main sponsors of MG 100 at Beaulieu, are to host their next Open Day at the Gang Warily event grounds near Fawley on Saturday 30 August.

Multiple MGs in next SWVA auction

A diverse selection of MGs appears in the next SWVA Classic Auction at Holton Heath on Thursday 31 July.

First up (Lot 7) is a 2001 MGF in British Racing Green with a black soft top over a cloth interior with a genuine reading of 70,902 miles. It has had just two owners from new and has a guide price of £800- £1,200.

Lot 40 is a 1972 MGB GT finished in Blaze Red with a contrasting fawn leather interior and a walnut dashboard. It has been fitted with a Ford Sierra five-speed gearbox and has an estimate of £4,000-£5,000.

Lot 78 is a 2004 MG TF 115 Sunstorm with an MOT history that supports the reading of 25,947 miles from new. It could be yours for £2,000-£3,000.

Carrying the same MGTF designation but from an earlier age is Lot 84, a 1954 MG TF in black with a matching black soft top and side screens, complemented by a green leather interior. It comes from a local MG club member and has an estimate of £10,000-£12,000.

A 1969 MGB in British Racing Green with a black soft top and beige leather interior appears as Lot 92 - see photo right.



It features comfort seats, a wind stop and a Moto-Lita steering wheel, and it is sold with both full and half tonneau covers. It underwent a comprehensive bare-metal restoration by Jentree Classic Cars of Lewes.

Mechanical upgrades include a fast road Stage 2 engine plus, all new body panels, doors, boot, bonnet, a full respray and rust protection via waxoyl and underseal. This example has a guide price of £6,000-£8,000.

MGs on track at Goodwood Festival

MG used the recent Goodwood Festival of Speed to unveil two new all-electric models - the MG IM5 executive saloon (pictured right) and MG IM6 SUV (seen in action below).

The IM5 Long Range can travel up to 441 miles on a single charge with the 100 kWh battery option sitting on a new 800V architecture capable of delivering a 10 to 80 percent charge in just 17 minutes. Both feature powerful electric Hurricane motors with 0 to 62mph achieved in just 3.2 seconds for MG IM5, and 3.5 seconds for MG IM6.

MG IM models are defined by technology-led, premium cabins. Innovative features such as Rainy Night Mode and 4 mode One Touch Park Assist, which utilises the car's 360 degree cameras and autonomous driving capabilities to perform complex parking manoeuvres automatically.

Urban driving is made simpler still with the introduction of bi-directional, rear wheel turning technology, reducing the turning circle on the MG IM5 to 9.98 metres.

A focal point of the cabin is the immersive, ultra-HD 26.3 inch infotainment display which is supported by a 10.5 inch touchscreen. All cars feature a panoramic roof and a bespoke audio system featuring 20 speakers with the addition of four in-ceiling Sky Speakers for the richest, fullest sound.

MG is introducing six models into its UK home market, with a choice of 75kWh and 100kWh batteries as well as single and dual motor options.



The IM5 range starts at £39,450 for the Standard 75 kWh version, with the Long Range 100 kWh model priced at £44,995, and the 100 kWh Performance variant available for £48,495. The larger IM6 SUV begins at £47,995 for the Long Range 100 kWh model, rising to £50,995 for the Performance version, and £52,995 for the exclusive Launch Edition.

Also appearing at Goodwood was the Cyberster Black featuring a black finish and the MG Cyber X (see below) concept a compact, all-electric urban explorer featuring matte grey finish and pop-up headlights,

MG has announced that its existing MG4 EV and the MGS5 EV will be available with a grant of £1,500 which will be over and above any incentives currently offered by MG's 155 UK dealer partners.
