This month we can announce more details for the club's new venture, the Dorset Dawdle which takes place on 06 September - I hope that every club member has the date firmly marked in their diary.

The scenic 87-mile route has been planned (but will be fine-tuned closer to the day) and various lunch options investigated. We are also working on some extra goodies for the day with some give-aways for everyone taking part and a prize for the furthest travelled car and driver.

An entry form is now available via the 1020 website or from me at the May club night so please book your places as early as possible. I will also be looking for club members to support the venture in other ways such as providing tombola prizes.

WESTBOURNE CARNIVAL

A few places are still available for the 1020 display at the Westbourne CARnival on Saturday 16 May. The final arrangements have been released by the organisers which show a slight change in the finish time and an expansion of the event due to the high demand for places.

Club members are asked to be on site and by 9.30am at the latest, ahead of the event officially opening at 10am. The roads will then be closed to vehicle movements until 4pm - this has been dictated by the local authorities (Bournemouth BID) and not the event organisers and is an hour later than previously advertised. This means that you and your cars will have to be on site for six and a half hours before you can depart.

The organisers assure me that there will be plenty to see and do with live music, an artisans market, special showings in the Coliseum Cinema Bar and various catering outlets in the local bars and cafes etc.

Because both Seamoor Road and Poole Road (along the one-way system) are being closed for the event, entry for exhibitor vehicles will be via the east where Poole Road, Seamoor Rd and Milburn Road meet - marshals will be on hand to direct people.

If you would like to join us on the day you can either tell me at the May club night and I can hand you your event pass, or you can email and I can send you your pass via email.

STANSTED PARK MG GATHERING

Solent MGOC have reminded me that they are holding their annual event, MGs in the Park, at Stansted House, Rowlands Castle near Portsmouth on Sunday 17 May, starting at 10am.

There is no need to book but a charge of £15 per car (cash only) is required on entry. This includes a free raffle entry, a magnetic plaque and half-price admission. May club night - MG history on film

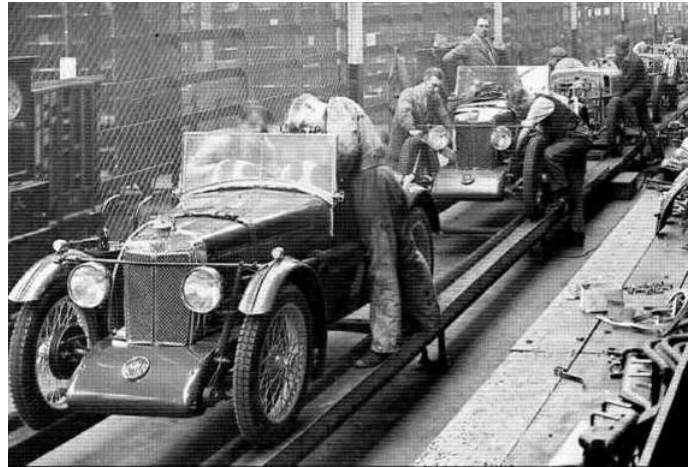

Chris Adamson will also be distributing Hamworthy Club membership cards for those who booked them at last month's club night and have yet to receive them - these give a 10% discount on food and drinks at the club so it will be worthwhile collecting when you arrive to save you money on the night.



Summer Road Run and Hog Roast

If it's not already in your diary, then please mark-up Sunday 28 June as this is when we will be organising our 1020 Summer Road Run and Hog Roast - an event which is always popular with club members.

The 43-mile route (devised by Adrian Mullins) starts at Hamworthy Club and finishes at Morden Village Hall where the hog roast (with salads and accompaniments) will be served from 1pm - there are vegetarian and vegan options available.



Entry fee for the run is £5 with the hog roast (which replaces the BBQ served in recent years) costing £20 per head to include hot and cold drinks and a dessert - this must be booked and paid for at the time of entering for the event.

The closing date for entries is Monday 15 June - after that date refunds will not be available as the food will have been paid for in advance with the caterers.

Picnic in the Park at Upton

For those not planning to be part of the club display at the Macmillan Caring Locally Summer fete on Saturday 27 June (the day before our Summer Run and Hog Roast) there is an alternative in the Poole area - Lytchett Minster and Upton Town Council is organising a Picnic in the Park at Upton Recreation Ground from 1pm until 5.30pm and they are inviting classic cars to take part.

Entries open for the Dorset Dawdle

Entries are now open for the inaugural 'Dorset Dawdle' which will take place on Sunday 06 September and feature an extended 87-mile literary themed one-day road run for MG owners that will visit towns, villages and other locations that appear in many of Dorset author Thomas Hardy's famous Wessex novels.

It includes Hardy's birthplace (see right) and Max Gate house where he wrote many of his best-known works (both are run by the National Trust and admission is not included in the Dawdle). The route book will feature notes to explain the significance of the locations and where they appear in the classic works by the Victorian novelist and poet.



Start and finish point will be the club's regular meeting place, the Hamworthy Club at Canford Magna near Wimborne where there will be reserved parking - there will be the optional extra of pre-booking breakfast baps before starting the road run.

After signing-in cars will be flagged away from 10am at regular intervals on a leisurely circular journey that will take them west into the heart of Hardy Country before returning to the Hamworthy Club to enjoy a traditional Dorset Cream Tea (included in the entry fee).

There is no designated lunch stop but various pubs and other catering outlets on the route will be identified and details about them (including how to book lunch in advance) will be included in the final instructions which will be sent out to all participants ahead of the day.

All profits are going to the club's two charities - Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance and Macmillan Caring Locally - it is hoped that both will be in attendance on the day.

Entry fee is £35 for a car and two occupants or £27.50p for a car and driver only. This will include a rally plate, route book / event programme, finisher's certificate and the Dorset Cream Tea which will be available from 2.30pm. The optional breakfast baps with a hot drink can be pre-ordered for £6 a head.

There will be an award for the driver and car that has travelled the furthest to take part in the event so recommend the day to friends and family outside the area who own an MG - encourage them to take part.

Jigsaw factory visit - its a puzzle

The jigsaw puzzle table has always been a popular attraction at our Athelhampton day and raises a lot of cash for our charities so is obviously a popular pastime among club members - therefore the committee thought, why not organise a trip to see how jigsaws are made.

On Wednesday 08 July club members are being invited to visit the Grovely Jigsaw factory which is located at Unit 3 South's Farm Yard, Noade Street, Ashmore, Salisbury, Dorset, SP5 5AA (not far from Compton Abbas airfield) There is a maximum of 30 places and the tour starts at 1.30pm and takes around 90 minutes, concluding with tea and cakes.

The fee is £16 per person (including the tea and cakes) which is payable in cash only on the day when you arrive - any cancellations must be notified as soon as possible before the day. Access to the tour is all on level ground and the site is accessible for wheelchairs and walkers.

Started in 1997, Grovely Jigsaws is one of only a handful of traditional cardboard jigsaw puzzle manufacturers left in the UK. It is owned and run by Brian and Julie and operates from a converted cow barn where they are assisted by a small group of staff, making a wide range of images in all shapes and sizes for their own label puzzle ranges as well as customer branded jigsaws.

Julie and Brian have recently expanded their product range by adding wooden jigsaw puzzles, using industry leading laser cutting machinery imported and installed in 2023 and they also offer a customised jigsaw service.

Canford Classics and Supercars

Owners are required to apply via the website providing outline details of their car and attaching several images - they will then be contacted by email advising if they have been accepted.

Once you have been successful, club members are asked to contact Eddie Milligan who will take a list of names and vehicles and arrange the meeting at Hamworthy Club prior to the convoy run into the school. Gates open to the public at 10am and the show finishes at 4pm.

Spring Road Run to Haynes International

A total of 21 cars took part in the 1020 Spring Road Run which took participants on a 42-mile cross-country route to visit the Haynes International Motor Museum at Sparkford where most people opted to make use of the discounted club admission price.

Those who ventured around the museum were able to admire the UK's largest collection of cars and motorcycles, with over 300 vehicles housed in 15 exhibition spaces showcasing automotive innovation and motoring history from around the world.

There were plenty of vehicles on show displaying the MG Octagon, especially in the re-created Morris Garage where the likes of a 1938 TD Midget faced a 1967 MGB Roadster and a 1032 MG Magnette K1

Thanks to Alasdair Wellwood who organised the route and the museum entry arrangements for us.



Midgets and MGBs in latest SWVA sale

A quartet of MGs appear in the catalogue for the latest South Western Vehicle Auctions Classic Sale which takes place on Thursday 30 April.

First up at Lot 30 is a 1973 MGB GT finished in Damask Red over a navy blue cloth interior which has been in the same family ownership since 1982 and which underwent a full engine rebuild by Perrertt Engineering in 1987 with only 2,000 miles covered since 1990.

It comes with a collection of MOT certificates and invoices and has a come and get guide price of between £3,000-£4,000



Five lots later (Lot 35) is the first of two Midgets: this example finished in Damask Red is over a black interior with matching soft top. It has been owned by the current keeper for the last four years and has a good history showing that the 68,000 miles could be genuine. This tidy and well-cared-for example features recent replacement coil plug leads, points, condenser and distributor cap, along with a fresh oil and filter change. It has an estimate of £3,500-£4,500.

Lot 39 is a Mk III Midget in Vermillion Red with a black soft top over a black leather interior, where recent work includes new carpets, a new alternator and regulator while replacement gaskets have been fitted to both the top and bottom of the engine, with the engine itself having been replaced at 95,000 miles.

It comes with a Midget Mk III handbook, an original MG "Passport to Service" booklet which contains four stamps for services completed between 1973 at 1,163 miles and 1974 at 18,414 miles and records a detailed diary of work carried out on the vehicle between 1976 and 1999. It is looking for a new home at between £4,000 and £5,000

Finally, Lot 45 is a final run low mileage 1980 MGB GT LE in Pewter Grey Metallic over a cloth interior. It has just two previous owners and claims 38,937 miles from new and was recommissioned in 2025, including a new battery and the fitment of an unleaded cylinder head. The catalogue lists it at £5,000-£6,000 but it could go for more as the value of LE Editions has increased in recent years.

Concours and more at Wilton House

Wilton House at Salisbury is hosting a Concours des Légendes event over the weekend of 19-21 June promising a rich, immersive celebration of motoring culture in all its forms.

Across three main stages, visitors will be able to hear the stories of designers, owners, racers and collectors through curated displays, intimate talks and workshops. Special guests include the likes of F1 star turned artist Stefan Johansson; designers Peter Stevens and Ken Okuyama; legendary test driver Valentino Balboni and Le Mans winners Derek Bell and Richard Attwood.

Other guests include Andy Green OBE the driver of Thrust SSC, who remains the only person to have driven a car faster than the speed of sound.



Also, there will be Pink Floyd drummer Nick Mason (pictured above) who will be discussing music, cars and his exploits at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, where he competed five times between 1979 and 1984.

Beyond the main stages and speaker programme there is a display of iconic Formula 1 helmets, motoring art exhibitions and an artisan and skills showcase. Details can be found at: www.concoursdeslegendes.co.uk

Are EVs now a realistic option?

As regular readers of my new MG model road tests in *Enjoying MG* will know I am still a sceptic about the practicalities of fully electric vehicles due, in the main, to the variability of real-world EV battery ranges and the access to working public charging points.

However, a new report from Vestel Mobility suggests that range anxiety is becoming a thing of the past as modern EV technology, fast-growing charging networks and convenient home charging make running out of battery power extremely unlikely in the UK.

According to the latest statistics, the UK now has almost five times more public EV charging locations than petrol stations, nearly 42,000 sites, compared with around 8,400 fuel stations.

Even in rural areas, the maximum distance between chargers is about 9 to 10 miles, and in cities like London, the network is incredibly dense, with 25,000 public chargers alone.

The growth continues at pace: over 1,000 new public chargers are added every month, helping keep up with the increasing number of EVs on the road.

Early public chargers could be unreliable but, today, UK regulations require rapid chargers to maintain 99 per cent uptime and most networks exceed this. For example, InstaVolt reports 99.53 per cent availability across its network. A big advantage of EVs is that you can 'refuel' overnight at home. Around 680,000 UK homes already have chargers and roughly two-thirds of homes could support one.

Home charging is cheap: many providers, including Octopus Energy, offer overnight rates as low as 8 to 11p per kWh. A basic 7kW home charger can give around 140 miles of range overnight, enough for most people's daily journeys.

For those with higher-capacity systems, Vestel's Libra 7/22kW charger can deliver up to 100kWh overnight, while the Vesper 40 DC charger adds fast top-ups in an hour or two. For most drivers, this means leaving home with a full battery almost every day.

Another old worry is that EVs take forever to charge. Modern high-power chargers, 150kW, 300kW, and even higher, can add 100 miles in around 10 minutes. Vestel Mobility is already rolling out 720kW and 1MW chargers in service hubs across the UK. Most EVs accept up to 250kW, which still allows a full charge in minutes, comparable to filling a petrol tank and buying a coffee.

Battery technology has come a long way. Most mass-market EVs now achieve 250 to 300 miles per charge, and premium models exceed 350 miles. The UK's best-selling EV, the Tesla Model Y, claims 331 to 379 miles, with real-world tests confirming these figures. Even in cold weather or with enthusiastic driving, range is more than enough for everyday use.

Even on the rare occasion of running low, UK drivers aren't stranded. Major breakdown services have solutions for EVs. At the RAC their EV Boost vans carry onboard chargers that can add 5-10 miles of range, enough to reach the next station, and at the AA their Freewheeling hubs can tow EVs safely, and some vans carry small mobile chargers for quick top-ups.

Sally Bailey, head of EVC Sales UK at Vestel Mobility says: "Thanks to advances in EV technology, a fast-growing charging network and convenient home charging, the reality is simple: most UK drivers don't need to worry about running out of charge. EVs aren't just about convenience, they're about creating a cleaner, greener transport system. With over 50 per cent of the UK's electricity from renewable sources, switching to EVs helps reduce emissions from the 42 million vehicles on UK roads."



Drive it Day - Cream Teas and Trains

Blue skies and warming sunshine accompanied the 1020 MG gathering for National Drive it Day at Shillingstone Station, part of the North Dorset standard gauge heritage railway, located between Blandford Forum and Sturminster Newton.



Members were able to take their time viewing the exhibits at the venue, such as a range of static wagons and locomotives, some in the process of being restored, the colourful refurbished station buildings (including a signal box), a museum, cinema wagon, souvenir and book shop.

Most club members also took up the opportunity of a pre-booked cream tea in the vintage railway carriage served on period china. Others tucked into curry and ice creams (not together).
