He was also able to motivate others and this helped the club to win many prizes and awards at various local car shows.



Graham enjoyed the good things in life so was always up for a meal out and a decent bottle of wine; he could also tell a good story and had plenty of those from his times as sales director at Moores Engineering. He will be greatly missed by many.

# Graham Lowe 1941 - 2026

As all club members should already be aware, former 1020MGOC Club Chairman and Area Secretary Graham Lowe died unexpectedly on Wednesday 17 June.

Graham was preparing to join other club members for the mid-month pub meeting and meal at The Lamb Inn at Winton near Christchurch when he collapsed and died of a suspected heart attack. He had only recently been discharged from Bournemouth Hospital following a mild heart attack, and was looking forward to meeting up with friends and colleagues again.

He had attended the previous Sunday's opening Classic Car meeting of the season on Christchurch Quay and, despite a slight lack of mobility, was able to chat to many old friends, both from the club and the wider classic car community where he was a well-known figure.

Graham was one of the longest serving members of 1020; he and his late wife Danni were regulars at all club events in their distinctive red 1969 MGB Roadster - the car actually belonging to Danni who, despite being French by birth, was a strong Anglophile and great MG enthusiast.

It was Graham who spearheaded a new era for the club when he took over the role of 1020 Area Secretary from Nigel Hedges and formed the first club committee to spread the workload as the number of club activities increased. He became the inaugural club Chairman, with Danni at his side, and he oversaw the creation of the first formal constitution with the introduction of an annual general meeting and annual accounts.

During this period under Graham's leadership the club went from strength to strength, organising more and diverse activities including a trip to France, seasonal road runs, guest speakers at club nights, the introduction of a 'Club Member of the Year' award and a move to monthly club meetings at the Hamworthy Club near Wimborne.

Further afield, Graham and Danni were regular fixtures at regional events, such as the gatherings at Cricket St Thomas and the Jersey Run. They also led the club team at MGB50 at a slightly damp Blenheim Palace where they were reunited with long-time friend MGOC founder member, Roche Bentley.



Chris Adamson who succeeded Graham as 1020 Area Secretary said: "Graham was a stalwart of the club and, for many years, its driving force; he was enthusiastic about all things MG and was a great ambassador of the brand.

"As well as being extremely knowledgeable about all things MG, Graham was a great people person, he could get on with everyone and, for many, was the first person they met when joining the club. I have had so many people tell me how welcome Graham made them at their first meeting and how these friendships have endured over the years."

One of Graham's last official duties was helping to cut the 1020 40th birthday cake in 2024 alongside his predecessor Nigel Hedges and his successor Chris Adamson.

# North Coast 500 in and MGB V8

You may remember from a previous 1020 newsletter that fellow club members Ian and Susan Hanstead drove the clockwise North Coast 500 in 2023 in their RV8 - well, they have been at it again this year, but this time anticlockwise in their recently acquired BGT V8 to see the sights in a different direction - yes, Ian says it does make a difference.

Ian reports on their latest adventure . . . 'This time, due to space, we were able to take a couple of small suitcases. To save worrying about food, all overnight stops were B&Bs or hotels. We travelled about 85 miles a day over eight days, then a week 'relaxing' on the edge of the Lake District.

We began again at the start/finish point of Inverness Castle, taking a detour onto the Black Isle (Andy Munden recommended), then up the east coast. As we visited several of the key landmarks last time, first scenic stop was top Northeast - Duncansby Head Stacks (which features a lot on Scottish calendars) looking out to Stroma.



Then it was a quick photo opportunity in front of the John O'Groats fingerpost before dropping in at the Castle of Mey (the late Queen Mother's residence) for cream teas. We then stopped a few nights at Dunnet (visited next door - Dunnet Gin Distillery!) before moving along across the topmost region where the single-track roads started and the speed is limited due to giving way.

A must was the Chocolate Mountain at Durness for a renowned hot chocolate, setting us up for heading south where the scenery changes to becoming spectacular.

This time we did the optional route Kylesku to Inverinver section - very narrow single-track roads, hill one side of you, steep drop the other, bends, hills (including several 25 per cent ones) and many, many blind summits. This required lots of first gear as you couldn't see over the top for on-coming vehicles or which way the road went.

Once you have driven this stretch you need a rest and power steering is essential. Then through the Glens to Applecross. The following day it was up and over Bealach-na-Ba - and surprisingly the uppermost six miles have been resurfaced.

On the whole route we saw plenty of TR4As (many Dutch registrations), TVRs, Lotus, Austin Healey Sprites (see right) and ... one solitary MGF. The BGT V8 certainly attracted much attention everywhere we stopped (questions, photos, etc) - even a juggernaut driver on the M6 calling out when held up in a traffic jam!



In total we covered 1,946 miles and averaged 31.57mpg .

We are already thinking about doing the West Coast up and down again but, perhaps, in a couple of years.

# Quomps finally hosts classics

After two failed attempts (due to damp ground conditions) Classic Car meetings finally took place on Christchurch Quay on 14 and 21 June and there were several club members in attendance to soak up the sunshine and the atmosphere on both occasions.

Due to another event being cancelled, the organisers have been able to add an extra date to the previously announced calendar - this will be on Sunday 26 July. A reminder that the event is open to cars registered before 2001 and the gates open this year from 11am (an hour later than previously).

Participants are requested to pay a £2 fee (cash) on entry and to use a drip tray when their vehicles are parked. As, has been the case in former years, the event is weather dependent and can be cancelled if there has been rain the day before or if rain is forecast. This is because the Quomps is prone to flooding.

After assembling at the Exbury Club in the heart of the forest near Beaulieu, participants (cars ranged in ages from YBs and YTs to MGAs and MGBs up to modern MG4s and TFs) headed out on a 82-mile road route that traversed north through the forest passing locations such as the National Motor Museum, Cadnam, Paultons Park and East Wellow (which features the grave of Florence Nightingale).

This came before skirting the southern fringes of Salisbury then returning south using Telegraph Hill (the site of an 18th century semaphore station) and following the line of the Solent back to Exbury.

Thanks to 1009 once again for another enjoyable route and day out in the forest.

MG is promising the world debut of two new concept cars on their stand at this year's Goodwood Festival of Speed which runs from 09 to 12 July.

Both concept cars showcase elevated brand products in different segments of the EV market. One is a new B-segment electric hatchback due to join the MG range in 2027, while the other is a an all-new electric concept design.
